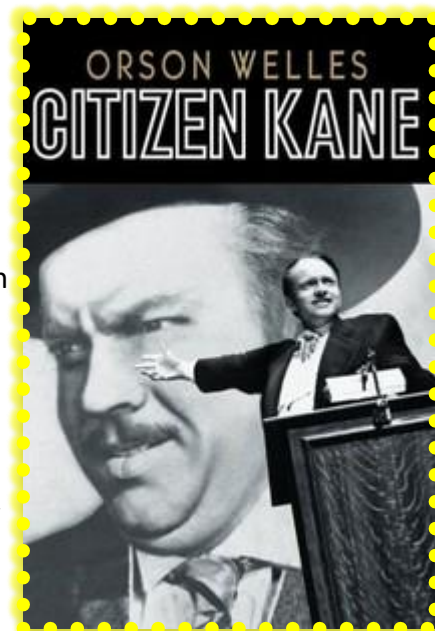


April Library U!

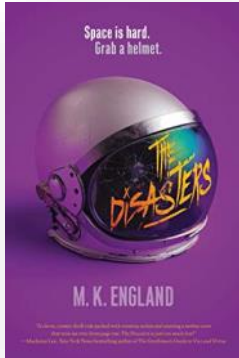

The Pioneer Woman Magazine

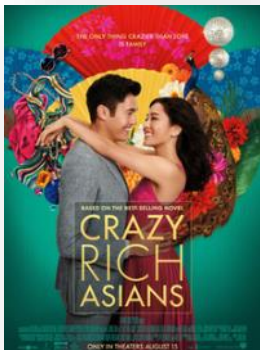

The Accidental Beauty Queen

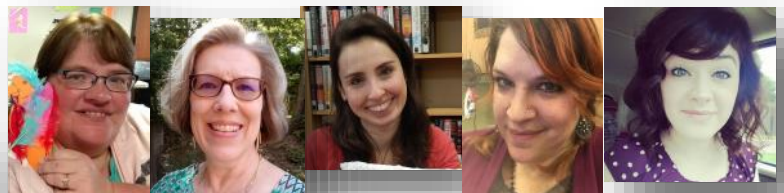

"Cat in the Stacks" Series

I love it when I find a cozy mystery series that I enjoy. I have found another one on Sunflower eBooks through our website (any patron with a library card may check out eBooks through Sunflower). It is a series called "Cat in the Stacks"...yes, books and cats...and murder! The author is Miranda James, which is actually one of the pen names that Dean James writes under. There are 12 books currently in the series, with the 13th one coming out in July 2019; Sunflower has 8 of them. The first in the series is *Murder Past Due*. Set in Athena, Mississippi, Charlie Harris is the good-natured librarian who has a rescued Maine coon cat named Diesel that walks on a leash. He comes back to his hometown following the death of his wife and works as an archivist at the local college as well as volunteers at the public library. One of Charlie's former classmates is a famous author and the pride of Athena, but Charlie remembers him as an arrogant, manipulative jerk—and he's



not the only one. The famous author's homecoming as a distinguished alumnus couldn't possibly go worse: by dinner, the author is dead. Now it's up to Charlie, with some help from Diesel, to work through the town's grudges and find the killer before an impatient deputy throws the book at the wrong person, but it seems all of Charlie's friends and co-workers had a score to settle with the nasty novelist. I'm currently reading the fifth book in the series; it's one of those series that I'm hoping the author never stops writing. —reviewed by Lesa
